Assembly Member Bill Scarborough visits Queen Chamber

NYS Assembly Member William Scarborough, chair of the committee on Small Business, met with leaders of the Queens Chamber of Commerce, Friday, December 9, 2011. Following the Assemblyman's initial remarks, the members and guest of the chamber engaged Mr. Scarborough in a lively discussion on NYS economic policies including the regional economic development councils, locating a convention center in Queens (as recommended by the NYC Regional Economic Council), outreach to small businesses on state business assistance programs and other small business concerns.
