NYC CENTRAL LABOR COUNCIL SUPPORTS I. DANEEK MILLER FOR RE-ELECTION TO THE CITY COUNCIL

The New York City Central Labor Council (CLC), a federation of 300 labor unions representing 1.3 million members across the New York City region, [endorsed](#) I. Daneek Miller for re-election as New York City Council Member for the 27th District (Southeast Queens).

"On behalf of the 300 unions and 1.3 million working men and women of the New York City Central Labor Council, AFL-CIO, we are proud to endorse Council Member Daneek Miller for re-election," said Vincent Alvarez, President of the New York City Central Labor Council, AFL-CIO. "As a former union president, Council Member Miller understands the importance of ensuring that working families have the wages, benefits, and workplace standards necessary to live with dignity in New York City. He has stood with us on picket lines, rallied with us to protect jobs, and as Chair of the City Council's Civil Service and Labor Committee, he's sponsored and advocated for legislation to address issues affecting New York City's working men and women. We look forward to continuing to stand with Council Member Miller to help protect working people in Queens, and throughout our great city."

As Chair of the City Council's Committee on Civil Service and Labor, Councilman Miller passed laws to better the lives of working families. This includes paid sick leave, paid family leave for public employees, and protecting building service, school custodial, grocery store and fast food workers.

"We preserved thousands of good paying Union jobs," stated Councilman Miller who previously served as President of Amalgamated Transit Union Local 1056 and co-chair of the MTA Labor Coalition. "Our efforts made a difference for working people. This includes saving 4,000 jobs for school bus drivers and attendants."

"No municipal union had contracts when I took office," added the Councilman. "Today 99% of labor reached agreements. Further, we reduced wage disparities between men and women and I sponsor legislation to enforce pay equity for the city's workforce."

Daneek has lived in Southeast Queens in the 27th Council District for the nearly four decades. He also serves as Democratic District Leader for Part A of the 33rd Assembly District. Prior to taking public offices his involvements included the Southern Queens Parks Association, the NYC Middle School Sports Association, Brothers Unlimited and United Black Men of Queens.
