CSA SUPPORTS I. DANEEK MILLER FOR CITY COUNCIL DIST. 27

The Council of School Supervisors & Administrators (<u>CSA</u>) Local 1: American Federation Of School Administrators, AFL-CIO, the collective bargaining unit for 6,000 Principals, Assistant Principals, Supervisors and Education Administrators who work in the NYC public schools and 200 Directors and Assistant Directors who work in city-subsidized Centers for Early Childhood Education (ECE) today announced its endorsement of Daneek Miller for New York City Council Member for the 27th District (Southeast Queens).
