He will fight to make our Libraries accessible community centers open seven days a week, 10-14 hours each day, work with community boards, community senior programs, faith-based and community groups to identify preferred locations for senior housing with supportive services and help direct capital and other dollars to create the housing and help protect residents from foreclosures.
